FIRST FRIDAY & FIRST SATURDAY DEVOTIONS....

As we begin to settle into the new liturgical year, it is fitting to review the significant and spiritual rewards of some time honored devotions practiced at St. Peter Catholic Church. The First Saturday Devotion originates from a request from Mary the Mother of God under the title: **Our Lady of Fatima**. Mary appeared to three children in Fatima, Portugal in 1917. She introduced herself as the Lady of the Rosary. Her request for us was that on the first Saturday of five consecutive months, we receive Holy Communion, go to Confession, (it can be 8 days before or after), recite five decades of the rosary, and spend fifteen minutes (at least) in prayer and meditation in her company. All this must be done with the intention of making reparation for insults, sacrileges, and indifference committed against the Immaculate heart of Mary. She has promised to those who do this to assist them in the hour of their death with all the graces necessary for their salvation. The recitation of the prayer of the Consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary is also recommended as part of the practice of this devotion. Sister Lucia, one of the three children wrote that the practice of this devotion or lack of it will determine whether there is peace or war in the world.

The Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus Christ came about through the visions of Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque a sister of the Religious Order of the Visitation in France, beginning on December 27, 1673. Through these visions, Our Lord promises whoever consecrates himself to the Sacred Heart of Jesus with the prayer of Consecration, will receive the following promises: Graces from Christ, peace in the home, comfort in afflictions, refuge in life and death, blessings in abundance, mercy, zeal for the Faith, the blessing of the place where an image of the Sacred Heart is placed and honored, faith and conversion for the most hardened hearts, and graces for promoting the devotion in others. There is also a promise that those who receive Holy Communion on the first Friday for nine consecutive months, will not die before receiving the sacraments when their hour has come, and the grace of final perseverance, not dying in disgrace (a state of mortal sin).

These devotions are forms of prayer in the Church, time honored and time tested. They have proven to be means of grace by their invocation of Our Lord and participation in the sacramental life. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states: "Prayer in the events of each day and each moment is one of the secrets of the Kingdom revealed to 'little children' to the servants of Christ, to the poor of the Beatitudes." (CCC 2659). But it is important to note that prayerful devotions are inspired by our faith in God and our practice of the Faith in living out the imitation of Christ daily in our lives. It is frequently stated in Scripture that Jesus could do little in a certain town or community because of the lack of faith in its people. Christ has chosen the effect of His power and grace in us, to be determined by our faith. Therefore our practice of these devotions cannot simply just be recited, but must be accompanied with the living out of one's faith to be effective in God's Grace. May God bless our devotions with His grace.

Compassionate Heart of Jesus, graciously listen to our prayers. Give us generous hearts to respond to Your call in our lives. BULLETIN BITES

January 22, 2012

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." Mk 1:14-20

After a lifetime of struggling to catch fish from the Sea of Galilee and building a business with Simon and Andrew, Zebedee surely hoped his sons, James and John, would take over and relieve him of the labor of casting nets into the Sea and the dangers of the life of a fisherman. Then a man comes along and calls his sons to become *fishers of men* and they drop his nets and leave him. James and John could not have known what awaited them. Their mother apparently thought Jesus would establish an earthly kingdom and asked that her sons sit at his side. But it is Zebedee, with the wisdom that sometimes comes with age, who understood the real implications and challenges of the invitation of Jesus to his sons to become *fishers of men*; to be men who by what they say and do challenge others to do good and avoid evil; who choose right rather than wrong; who imitate Jesus and accept the consequences. Zebedee must have been pleased with his sons. Are we prepared to be fishers of men to lead others to God by imitating Jesus?

Over and over, Jesus emphasized the importance of doing God's will. Years ago, I had an important decision to make and dedicated a weekend retreat of prayer to discern God's mind in the matter. In the quiet, I remembered reading that eagles introduce thorns to their nests to goad complacent nestlings to fly. Without discomfort, they stay put. My life's situation was similar; God's "barbs" had been prodding me to abandon security and spread my wings. When I returned home and met with the assistant principal about resigning from the classroom, I was startled to see in his office a painting of eaglets in a thorn-studded nest, leaning over the edge for their first flight! God's answers aren't always this clear cut, but He never fails to guide us when we seek His will. *Lord, teach me how to read the signs identifying the path You've chosen for me.* In Adoration we unite love with our Lord and respond to Jesus invitation, "Could YOU not spend at least one hour with me?" PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL INFORMATION

Father Ledoux and Father Janise along with a group of Parish Pastoral Council members have written a Parish Pastoral Council Constitution based upon guidelines from the Diocese for our parish. The newly written constitution was submitted and has been approved by Bishop Michael Jarrell, D.D. The new constitution is available for review on our website (www.sprcc.org) or in the parish office.

Upon the appointment of a new pastor, the currently seated council may be reappointed or it may be dissolved and a new board formed within six months. Fr. Ledoux has chosen to reappoint the seated elected council members but applying the new constitution's directives regarding terms. There is, therefore, one council member to be elected at this time for the Parish Pastoral Council. Nominations for this position on the council will be accepted on the weekend of January 28th and 29th; the election for this position will be held on the weekend of February 11th and 12th. The constitution requires that Parish Pastoral Council Members must meet the following criteria:

- Baptized and Confirmed Catholic
- Registered, supportive and active parishioner of St. Peter Parish
- Must be a participant in the ongoing life of the parish, especially Sunday Liturgy.
- If married, his/her marriage must be valid as determined by Canon Law.
- Canonically able to receive Holy Communion
- Committed to the giving of time, talent and/or treasure
- Minimum 18 year of age
- Of good moral conduct and reputation

Please be prepared on the weekend of January 28th and 29th to nominate individuals, or yourself if you desire, that you believe would serve St. Peter Parish well as a Parish Pastoral Council Member.
